<p><b>Community Crisis Services, Inc.</b></p> <p>This funding will support the operations of the Safe Passages Domestic Violence Safe House and provide targeted rental assistance to survivors transitioning out of shelter. CCSI provides 43 domestic violence-related beds for women, children, and men at the Safe Passages Domestic Violence Safe House, along with rental assistance and security deposit support for 10 households leaving the shelter. The Safe Passages Shelter is designed to offer a supportive environment for families and individuals to rebuild stability, fostering independence and self-sustainability. Residents also receive case management and support services during their shelter stay, extending to three months post-shelter. <p><b>Dimensions Healthcare</b></p> <p>Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Center of the University of Maryland Capital Region Health (DV/SAC)'s Housing Program provides technical assistance, training, and education to participants in a governmental sponsored housing program. This funding will provide partial salary support for two Victim Advocates and a Program Administrator for the DV/SAC. The positions will work collaboratively with the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development, New Future Bridge Subsidy Housing Program, and community businesses to provide placement of participants in the program and workshops for the housing recipients who are domestic violence survivors. <p><b>House of Ruth</b></p> <p>Funding will provide supplemental supportive and stabilizing services to Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) victims and their children enrolled in the HRM Safe Homes Strong Communities rapid rehousing program in Prince Georges County. The funds will provide flexible funding for Safe Homes participants to address barriers to success such as utility, food, and transportation assistance. Funds will also supplement the rental assistance program already in place and will promote stability and self-sufficiency for IPV survivors and their families. <b>WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT</b>	
<p><b>The Purple Skies at Prince George's Community College</b></p> <p>The Purple Skies at Prince George's Community College This funding will support The Purple Skies Workforce Development at PGCC program specifically for domestic violence survivors. The program utilizes a coordinated model for confirming survivor eligibility and referral (Mental Health and Wellness Center), providing advising (Vocational Support Services), awarding scholarships (Office of Financial Aid) and sharing of career and job training resources (Office of Career Development and Internships). The program also includes hardship funding (for computers, childcare/transportation, or other allowable costs) designed to connect 25 survivors with the education, information and resources enhance their upward economic mobility. <b>COUNSELING/MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES</b>	
<p><b>One Love Life Center</b></p> <p>This funding will support OLLC's Prince George's County Rehabilitative &amp; Community Justice Support program. The aim is to provide comprehensive services to those who come to the attention of the legal system because of domestic violence and offer an alternative to the punitive legal approach. Men's violence against their female partners is a lamentable reality because of the deep physical, emotional, and psychological wounds it inflicts on families involved. The program will provide an 18-week program that begins with an intensive 14 weeks where participants receive two (2) 90-minute therapy session each week. The final 4 weeks will consist of one (1) 90-minute session per week.</p>	<b>\$50,000</b>
<p><b>Mary's Center</b></p> <p>This grant will be used over a one-year period (January 2024 – January 2025) to support the salary and expenses for a full-time Domestic Violence (DV) Family Support Worker (FSW) in the Adelphi clinic in Prince George's County, who will help domestic violence survivors and their children to obtain domestic violence counseling and therapy to move past traumatic experiences and heal. The objective is to connect survivors of domestic violence with behavioral health counseling and on-going case management as they take steps to become self-sufficient. <b>ADVOCACY/LEGAL</b>	
<p><b>Ayuda</b></p> <p>Funding will increase the organization's capacity to meet the overwhelming demand for its Culturally Sensitive Domestic Violence Program to immigrant survivors of domestic violence. Providing comprehensive case management services including connecting clients to food, healthcare, clothing, housing, and financial assistance programs; supporting clients through any ongoing legal proceeding; advocating for clients with social services agencies; and providing emotional support for clients recovering from trauma. <p><b>CASA Prince George's County</b></p> <p>Funding will support a comprehensive program to address and advocate culturally appropriate services and coordination of providers for children and youth exposed to family violence, domestic violence, dating violence or trafficking; to improve the Court's handling of child maltreatment cases; and break the cycle of abuse that brought them into foster care so that they can either return home safely or find another safe, permanent location. CASA is partnering with the Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence and Family Justice Center to ensure appropriate training to its volunteers. <p><b>LaClinica del Pueblo</b></p> <p>Funding will provide a needs assessment of thirty (30) Latina survivors of domestic violence who are residents of Prince George's County and connect them to legal, health, and social support services through culturally and linguistically appropriate, peer-led navigation services, according to their unique preferences and needs. Advocacy and navigation will be provided by peers known as <i>promotoras</i>. <i>Promotoras</i> can help clients work with the justice system and support them, under the guidance of legal counsel, as they proceed with actions such as obtaining restraining orders, as well as any other necessary legal services.
