<b><i>ADVOCACY/LEGAL</i></b>		
<b>Community Advocates for Family &amp; Youth, Inc. (CAFY)</b>	<b>\$ 85,000</b>	Community Advocates for Family & Youth, Inc. (CAFY) is seeking grant funding to provide a holistic group of services to clients, building from the baseline of the roadmap to survivorship developed between the client and their dedicated case manager. In order to maximize the impact of the PGCDV grant, CAFY proposes, a) cases management, b) legal support activities, c) education and awareness, and; d) partnering with Community Legal Services.
<b>Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.</b>	<b>\$ 50,000</b>	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc. is seeking grant funding to continue to progress on goals of continuity of representation for survivors from Temporary through Final Protective Orders. The requested funds will allow CLS to deepen our partnerships with CCSI and other community organizations and to assist more survivors. Our goal is to help stop domestic violence through legal protections for survivors and provide them with wrap-around legal services. We can do that with the help of the County Council.
<b>La Clinica del Pueblo, Inc.</b>	<b>\$ 40,000</b>	La Clinica del Pueblo is seeking grant funds to support the Advocating for Latina Survivors of Domestic Violence project. Our proposed project, Advocating for Latina Survivors of Domestic Violence in Prince George's County, aims to provide comprehensive, peer-led advocacy and navigation services to survivors of domestic violence. With critical support from the Prince George's County Council through the Domestic Violence Grant Program, the Entre Amigas team will screen, advocate for, and guide 30 unique Latina survivors to essential legal and social support services, and more depending on the client's individual needs. Survivors will be reached through our Primary Care Center in Hyattsville, community outreach initiatives, and referrals from partner agencies.
<b>Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) / Prince George's County</b>	<b>\$ 60,000</b>	Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA)/Prince George's County, Inc. requests funding to provide a comprehensive program of culturally appropriate advocacy and legal services and coordination of providers for children and youth exposed to family violence, domestic violence, dating violence or trafficking. Using trauma-informed practices, CASA seeks to address and advocate for the needs of youth who have been exposed to family violence, domestic violence, dating violence, or trafficking; improve the Court's handling of child maltreatment cases; and break the cycle of abuse that brought them into foster care so that they can either return home safely or find another safe, permanent home.
<b><i>COUNSELING / MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES</i></b>		
<b>Center for a Healthy - Maryland, Inc. - Health Care Coalition Against DV</b>	<b>\$ 50,000</b>	The Maryland Health Care Coalition is seeking funding to support the Survivors Wellness Project. This project will benefit victims and survivors of domestic violence by directly providing financial compensation, connection to other survivors and empowerment to impact other survivors. As well, the Coalition will use the information gleaned from these focus groups to further educate and support professionals working with survivors, including local domestic violence service providers, health care professionals, and therapists.



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<b><i>HOUSING</i></b>		
<b>Ladies of Hope Ministries Inc</b>	<b>\$ 50,000</b>	Ladies of Hope Ministries is seeking funding to support the Prince George's County Hope House project, The LOHM will engage two experienced consultants funded through general operating support. These consultants provide critical expertise to advance The LOHM's mission and to ensure that Hope House meets the highest standards of service delivery and operational efficiency.
<b>Dimensions Health Corporation / University of Maryland Capital Region Health</b>	<b>\$ 45,000</b>	Dimensions Health Corporation, the UM Capital Region Health Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault Center's (DV/SAC) Housing Advocacy program helps to reduce gaps in emergency shelter and long-term housing services by providing direct services and resources to survivors of domestic violence in Prince George's County, MD. The proposed program seeks to sustain and expand existing DV/SAC service offerings including hotel stay placements, safety planning, emergency resource provision, rent subsidy program enrollment, economic empowerment programming, and community referrals. We are requesting \$45,000 in funding to cover personnel costs and other expenses related to our housing advocacy program described below.
<b>Community Crisis Services Inc.</b>	<b>\$ 20,000</b>	Community Crisis Services Inc. is seeking funding to provide dedicated shelter and housing support. This grant will fund continued provision of safe shelter opportunities, rental assistance, and security deposit assistance for survivors of domestic violence in Prince George's County, Maryland.
<b>House of Ruth Maryland, Inc.</b>	<b>\$ 50,000</b>	House of Ruth Maryland is seeking grant funding to provide supplemental supportive and stabilizing services to IPV victims and their children enrolled in the HRM Safe Homes Strong Communities rapid rehousing program in Prince Georges County. The proposed funds will provide flexible funding for Safe Homes participants to address barriers to success such as utility, food, and transportation assistance. These funds will supplement the rental assistance program already in place and will promote stability and self-sufficiency for IPV survivors and their families.
<b><i>WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT</i></b>		
<b>The Training Source Inc</b>	<b>\$ 50,000</b>	The Training Source requests funding to provide workforce development training and supportive services to 12 survivors of domestic violence. The Training Source provides a safe, supportive environment in which domestic violence survivors ages 18+ can regain their confidence as they master the skills they need to find stable, living-wage employment with opportunities for advancement. Domestic violence (DV) survivors will participate in our Office & Professional Services training.
