<a href="#">100 Black Men of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$4,833	100 Black Men of Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting its mentoring programs and operations. More specifically, funds will support the mentoring, education, health and wellness, and economic empowerment programs.
<a href="#">Allentown Boys and Girls Club, Inc. - Fort Washington Branch</a>	\$1,500	Allentown Boys and Girls Club - Fort Washington Branch will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting a program of activities that will expose our county's children to positive experiences that aid growth and development. More specifically, the funds will go towards registration / rental fees for events, meetings, performance enhancement, equipment purchases and experiential education costs.

<a href="#">ARC of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$1,500	ARC of Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting all program activities carried out by The ARC that increase community inclusion of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. More specifically, funds will be used to pay for program elements that are not covered by the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA), including the costs of community activities in arts and recreation, and transportation.
<a href="#">Charity Carrousel, Inc.</a>	\$3,000	Charity Carrousel will use grant funds for expenses related to purchasing food for its Food Distribution Program, as well as purchasing a large freezer for storage of frozen meats and other items.
<a href="#">Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.</a>	\$1,500	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools will use grant funds for expenses related to working with students so that they acquire awareness of the structure and future trends within high skill, high wage public safety professions to increase their career options.
<a href="#">Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)</a>	\$1,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting its two major programs of providing annual scholarships to county high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to county families in need of assistance.
<a href="#">Community Builders, Ltd.</a>	\$2,000	Community Builders will use grant funds for expenses related to conducting its summer enrichment program, its after-school education program, training and development about healthy choices and year-round Leadership and Healthy Choices / Resiliency Workshops.
<a href="#">Ebenezer AME Stone of Help Community Development Corporation</a>	\$5,000	Ebenezer AME Stone of Help Community Development Corporation will use grant funds for expenses related to partnering with Ebenezer AME Church's Women's Resource and Restoration Center to provide assistance to women and families in crisis, as well as supporting a young ladies' life skills program to advance their overall well-being.

More specifically, these are the enrichment / recognition activity, the retention activities and the college preparation activities.
<a href="#">Food &amp; Friends, Inc.</a>	\$3,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds for expenses related to providing medically-tailored, home-delivered meals, groceries and nutrition counseling to eligible county residents living with cancer, diabetes, HIV / AIDS and other life-challenging illnesses.
<a href="#">Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association - Dollars for Scholars</a>	\$5,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association - Dollars for Scholars will use grant funds for expenses related to making scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors and continuing college students, as well as achievement awards to middle school students in the local communities of Hillcrest-Marlow Heights, Maryland.

(no website)</a>	\$5,000	Project Bright Future Mentoring Program will use grant funds for expenses related to serving dinner to furloughed workers and their family, as well as providing essential toiletries, toilet tissue, paper towels, feminine products, deodorant, toothpaste, diapers, dish detergent and plastic bags.

(no website)</a>	\$5,000	Reach Prince George's will use grant funds for expenses related to augmenting at-risk students' ability to compete by increasing technology skills. Funds will also assist senior citizens in striving for independence by supporting activities that enhance mobility and greater health.
<a href="#">River Jordan Project, Inc.</a>	\$3,500	River Jordan Project will use grant funds for expenses related to providing food and utility assistance for individuals and families impacted by the federal government furlough and for seniors and families who are food insecure.
