Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
Art Works Studio School, Inc.	\$10,000	Art Works Studio School will use grant funds to provide visual arts classes designed specifically for older adults in Prince George's County, including residents of several districts through a partnership with MNCPPC.
Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare (Bowie CLAW)	\$1,500	Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare will use grant funds to support their Trap-Neuter-Return program to reduce the feral cat population in Prince George's County.
Buffalo Soldiers Motorcycle Club of Maryland Foundation, Inc.	\$2,500	Buffalo Soldiers Motorcycle Club of Maryland Foundation will use grant funding to provide enhanced educational opportunities for multicultural, first-generation college students, and graduating high school students from under-served and underrepresented communities in Prince George's County. Educational opportunities are provided through awarding of scholarships that will support the enhancement of a college academic experience and aid the socio-economic identity of Prince George's County.
Bursting With Promise, Inc. (BWP)	\$5,000	Bursting with Promise will use grant funding to provide scholarships for qualified and deserving Maryland students entering Morgan State University, laptops for Prince George's County High School student essay winners, and, bookbags & supplies for Prince George's County elementary students.
Christmas in April Prince George's County	\$15,000	Christmas in April Prince George's County will use emergency special appropriation grant funds to distribute food baskets throughout Prince George's County to those in need.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$10,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools will use grant funds for expenses related to implementing a 10-week Driver's Education Program into the high schools and other non-profit organizations and offering public safety educational and informational tours to the Prince George's County public safety agencies.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., (CLS)	\$3,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use emergency special appropriation grant funds to supplement their programs to assist with the expected increase in the number of clients seeking services due to the COVID-19 pandemic with cases involving domestic violence, evictions, foreclosure, and other civil legal matters at partnered locations.
Delta Foundation, Inc.	\$1,000	Delta Foundation will use grant funds for expenses related to hosting a summit to address the impact of domestic violence on children in Prince George's County while partnering with community organizations and domestic violence professionals.
Ebenezer AME Stone of Help Community Development Corporation (no website)	\$5,000	Ebenezer AME Stone of Help Community Development Corporation will use emergency special appropriation grant funds to provide assistance in meeting basic needs food and household essentials for individuals and families during the crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.
Friendly High School	\$1,000	Friendly High School will use grant funds for expenses related to providing quarterly honor roll banquets in order to encourage students to attend school regularly and to acknowledge their academic accomplishments.
Friends of New Deal Café Arts (FONDCA)	\$2,500	Friends of New Deal Café Arts will use grant funds to provide support for the 2020 Greenbelt Blues Festival and 2020 Greenbelt Jazz Festival, which will celebrate local and regional Blues and Jazz musicians in Prince George's County and beyond. Both events are free all-day and non-ticketed festivals.
Greater Prince George's Business Roundtable, Inc.	\$5,000	Greater Prince George's Business Roundtable will use grant funding to establish jobs for writers, editors, photographers, videographers and graphic designers in COVID-19 and community support coverage.
Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services, Inc. (LARS)	\$1,500	Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services will use grant funds to cover the salary of LARS' Emergency Services Manager, who provides direct services to Prince George's County households in crisis and oversees the daily operations of LARS' Crisis Center.
Maple Springs Community Services Corporation (no website)	\$15,000	Maple Springs Community Service Corporation will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the six week summer Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics (STEAM) Academy program continuation into the fall school year 2019-2020. Additionally, funds will enable youth from its partnership with Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) to continue gaining additional experience through its Leadership Institute throughout the academic year.

<u>Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.</u>	\$1,000	Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area will use grant funds to purchase food items to assist with meal preparation for clients. Grant funds will be utilized to prevent the need to increase the price of the daily client contribution for service.
<u>Neighborhood Design Center, Inc.</u>	\$5,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds for expenses related to supplementing its community-based services beyond those supported by its CDBG-CDW funds to allow its staff to provide fuller support of its partners' requests for services beyond concept design to support plan implementation.
<u>Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council, Inc</u>	\$10,000	Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council will use emergency special appropriation grant funds to supplement their Emergency Relief Fund that is being launched in April to provide grants of \$1,000 for arts businesses, nonprofit arts organizations, and individual artists to meet urgent basic needs.
<u>Women Empowered to Achieve the Impossible, Inc. (WETATI)</u>	\$5,000	Women Empowered to Achieve the Impossible will use grant funds to provide entrepreneurship education to youth in order to equip and empower them to create and promote their own opportunities and find financial freedom through workforce development programs and idea competitions.
<u>Women's Community Club of Beltsville, Maryland</u>	\$1,000	Women's Community Club of Beltsville, Maryland will use grant funds to support its Holiday Food and Gift Program, Scholarship for College Students Program, and their Beautification Program.
