Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
Art Works Studio School, Inc.	\$1,500	Art Works School will be use grant funds to provide visual arts classes designed specifically for older adults in District I through a partnership with the MNCPPC and Art Works Now.
Beltsville Seventh-Day Adventist Church	\$7,000	Beltsville Seventh-Day Adventist Church will use grant funds to purchase and distribution of 300 Thanksgiving Turkey Baskets to District One Families.
Beltsville Seventh-Day Adventist Church	\$15,000	Beltsville Seventh-Day Adventist Church will use grant funds to assist them with providing meals and groceries for families that resides in Prince Georges County District 1.
B-Roll Media and Arts, Inc.	\$2,500	B-Roll Media and Arts will use funds to support free-of-cost media arts training and education to under-resourced youth ages 13-21 and youth with diagnosed learning disabilities in Prince George's County, MD.
Cherry Lane Boxing (no website)	\$2,000	Cherry Lane Boxing will use grant funds for Nutrition (Food/Drinks), Gym Equipment (Fitness Equipment/Gloves/Wraps/Etc.) and Mentorship (Speakers).
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)	\$1,500	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts will use grant funds to support and fund "The Performance Series" program, which embraces various elements in the performing arts.
College Park Arts Exchange, Inc.	\$2,500	College Part Arts Exchange will use funds to support Arts programming in District 1, including Arts Drop In and Seniors Programs at Youth and Family Services, College Park Community Library, and other North College Park venues.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., (CLS)	\$2,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds for general operating expenses. The funds will provide additional support to current programs and provide additional assistance to residents of Prince George's County.
Community Youth Advance	\$2,500	Community Youth Advance will use funds to deliver year-round quality academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.
Earth Report Inc. dba Patuxent Riverkeeper	\$1,000	The Patuxent Riverkeeper will use funds to support a multi-pronged approach to improving watershed health in the upper Patuxent region that will achieve greater impact than the sum of its parts.
Ecolatinos, Inc.	\$1,000	Ecolatinos will use grant funds to provide COVID-19 prevention practices and public engagement in clean water activities among Hispanic residents of Prince George's County while providing a COVID-19 informational and educational campaign and community environmental events.
Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc. (dba ECO City Farms)	\$1,000	ECO City Farms will use grant funds to support ECO's signature SEED2FEED Summer Youth Employment Program in Healthy Eating and Active Living that engages and feeds 22 Prince George's County High School youth daily for six weeks at ECO City Farms this Summer 2020.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for general operating support during FY20 to help support FGCB's three programs: Homework Club, College Success, and Great Minds Great Futures.
Laurel Advocacy & Referral Service, Inc.	\$20,000	Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services will use grant funds to support general operation of LARS, including increased food and direct financial assistant to Prince George's County residents of Laurel. A portion of the grant will also support the efforts of partners who are currently offering essential services that LARS does not provide.

Laurel Advocacy & Referral Services, Inc.	\$3,000	Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services will use grant funds towards the salaries of two full-time Emergency Services Case Managers (\$5,000) and to provide rental assistance to Prince George's County households facing eviction (\$5,000).
Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services, Inc.	\$7,500	Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services will use grant funds to provide rental assistance to five additional households with a pending eviction in Prince George's County. The remaining grant funds will be used towards the salaries of two full-time case managers who provide homeless outreach, referral services, and short-term case management to families and individuals facing a financial crisis.
Laurel Cats, Inc.	\$2,000	Laurel Cats will use grant funds to assist families from Prince George's County with the spay/neuter of their cats and cats they care for. Funds will also be used to spay/neuter cats found on the streets of Prince George County before adoption.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$1,500	Liberty's Promise will use grant funds to support after-school programs of civic engagement, held at High Point High School, twice annually (October-December and March-May) in 10-week sessions.
Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.	\$2,000	Meals on Wheels will use grant funds to obtain food for the clients, because during the unprecedented time of the COVID-19 pandemic, their health-vulnerable clients must stay at home in compliance with the Governor's executive order. As a result, their client numbers have substantially increased. They continue to operate in compliance within CDC guidelines and procedures.
Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.	\$3,000	Meals on Wheels of College Park will use funds to purchase food items to assist with meal preparation for their clients. This grant will prevent the need to increase the price of the daily client contribution for service.
Patrons for Peace Project, Inc.	\$2,500	Patrons for Peace Project will use grant funds to provide their clients housing allowance expense which includes monthly half-way house rents; provide one-on-one transportation for certain clients to help them appear in court on their trial dates, medical appointments to help with paperwork at Social Services and Social Security. As well as provide assistance with purchasing groceries and necessities.
Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council, Inc	\$1,000	Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council will use grant funds Prince George's County Arts Community Emergency Relief Fund.
Prince George's County Police T.E.P. (Triad, Explorers & PAL) (no website)	\$1,000	Prince George's County Police T.E.P. will use grant funds to fund the Prince George's County Police Explorer Program. Funds will go to Yearly Re-Charter, uniforms, travel expenses, Explorer and Advisor training, and community service opportunities.
Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program, Inc. (no website)	\$1,000	Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program will use grant funds to provide Christmas food baskets to as many underprivileged families in Prince George's County as possible and to provide relief on a case-by-case basis to families or persons in the County in emergency situations.
River Jordan Project, Inc.	\$1,500	River Jordan Project will use grant funds to procure emergency food and related packaging and distribution supplies for the food insecure Seniors, Adults, Children and Families, and emergency assistance to the uninsured and under-insured individuals with chronic diseases, cancer, or other illnesses impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic.
Side by Side, Inc.	\$3,500	Side by Side will use grant funds to support its Great Start parent workshop program. Families enjoy a meal and their children engage in fun learning activities, while parents attend workshops on how they can help their children build strong foundations in reading, math, and behavior. Grant funds will be used to pay for workshop instructors, interpreters for Spanish speakers, leaders of children's activities, and meal costs.
The Laurel Historical Society, Inc.	\$4,500	The Laurel Historical Society will use grant funds for special events and programs, including the McCeney March, Annual Gala, and educational resources.
Women's Community Club of Beltsville, Maryland	\$1,500	Women's Community Club of Beltsville, Maryland will use grant funds to support its Holiday Food and Gift Program, Scholarship for College Students Program, and their Beautification Program.
