<a href="#">ARC of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$10,000	ARC of Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to ensuring program safety during the COVID-19 pandemic, supporting programming that promotes community inclusion and independent living for individuals with I/DD by delivering activities that build work, volunteer and social skills.
<a href="#">Derek Anthony Moore Charities, Inc. [DAMCI]</a>	\$10,000	Derek Anthony Moore Charities will use grant funds to support their Spring and Summer Camp and enrichment activities primarily for youth 6-16 years old. DAMCI's Kids to Kamp program will provide funding to recreational, educational, and enrichment camp opportunities.
<a href="#">Forestville Boys and Girls Club of Prince George's County Maryland, Inc.</a>	\$28,600	Forestville Boys and Girls Club of Prince George's County Maryland will use grant funds for expenses related to continuing to provide needed services and update equipment and training aids for members participating in our mentoring through sports program. More specifically, funds will be used for equipment, related supplies, uniforms and training aids; for organization taxes and insurance; membership, website and post office box renewal, and community outreach efforts.
<a href="#">Glenarden Track Club</a>	\$20,000	The Glenarden Track Club will use grant funds for expenses related to purchasing uniforms and offsetting travel expenses to local and national track and field events.
<a href="#">Glenarden Unit 275 of The American Legion Auxiliary Department of Maryland</a>	\$10,000	Glenarden Unit 275 of the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Maryland will use grant funds to provide support to veterans, active duty military, their families, children and youth and the community through our outreach programs.
<a href="#">Kentland Boxing Association (no website)</a>	\$5,000	The Kentland Boxing Association will use grant funds to provide education, training and mentoring for at risk youth through the sport of boxing. The requested grant will provide funding for equipment, uniforms, space rentals, travel, and entry fees.
<a href="#">Milton Matthews Foundation, Inc.</a>	\$35,000	Milton Matthews Foundation for the Homeless will use grant funds for expenses related to transportation costs for anti-drug use impact programs provided to Prince George's County homeless residents. More specifically, funds will be used to purchase a reliable passenger van to implement its longstanding homeless feeding program.
<a href="#">Mission of Love Charities, Inc.</a>	\$100,000	Mission of Love Charities will use grant funds to support services to low-income and homeless individuals in Prince George's County. Services will include provision of furniture, clothing, day center, food, job training, access to computers, mental health.
<a href="#">Prince George's Child Resource Center, Inc.</a>	\$300,000	Prince George's Child Resource Center will use grant funds for expenses related to implementing an evidence-based home visiting program, Family Connects, in the stadium impact area. Once implementation is complete, a minimum of 500 mothers will receive post-natal home visits by a registered nurse to ensure the family is thriving.
<a href="#">Take Charge Juvenile Diversion Program, Inc.</a>	\$75,000	Take Charge Juvenile Diversion Program will use grant funds for expenses related to operationalizing the practice of restorative social justice in shifting the trajectory of at-risk youth from juvenile detention to successful life outcomes. More specifically, funds will serve a minimum of 60 youth who are pre-adjudicated youth or first-time offenders in the 16-week program which increases access to mental and behavioral health and wellness supports, leadership development opportunities, social and emotional learning and cultivation of skills to improve life outcomes.
<a href="#">The Training Source, Inc.</a>	\$23,600	The Training Source will use grant funds for expenses related to youth and adult job readiness training, youth leadership, college and career planning, supportive services (clothing, emergency food, assistance with Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) applications), 2020 Census hiring events and complete count committee events, and COVID-19 information. More specifically, grant funds will be used for purchasing office equipment and furnishings, training materials, and, primarily, laptops and hotspots.
<a href="#">United Communities Against Poverty, Inc. [UCAP]</a>	\$10,000	United Citizens Against Poverty, Inc. (UCAP) will use grant funds for expenses related to general operating support to allow it to provide supportive safety net service for the residents of Prince George's County. More specifically, funds will be used to supplement the "client assistance" line item in its FY 20 budget.
<a href="#">United Communities Against Poverty, Inc. [UCAP] - Shepherd's Cove Women's Shelter</a>	\$11,000	United Citizens Against Poverty, Inc. (UCAP) will use grant funds for expenses related to purchasing food for residents of Shepherd's Cove Women's Shelter.
<a href="#">Vision Elite Track Club (no website)</a>	\$10,000	Vision Elite Track Club will use grant funds for expenses related to paying team registration fees for regional and national competitions, purchasing new equipment, coaches' training and certification, and team travel.
