| Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund (CDMSF) | \$10,000 | Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund will use grant funds for expenses related to providing scholarships to eligible Prince George's County High School graduates going to college and for conducting and mentoring Project Enrich Program. |
| Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men | \$5,000 | Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County. |
| Food & Friends, Inc. | \$10,000 | Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves. |
| NAMI Prince George's County, Inc. | \$5,000 | NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to providing mental health support, education, advocacy and community outreach for county residents. |
| The Foundation for the Advancement of Music and Education, Inc. [FAME] | \$10,000 | The Foundation for the Advancement of Music and Education, Inc. [FAME] will use grant funds to support Summer Music Workshops for FAME youth. More specifically, funds will be used for Music Technology and an Instrumental Intensive for the FAME Jazz Band Program. |
| Prince George's Philharmonic | \$2,500 | Prince George's Philharmonic will use grant funds to support digital/virtual productions, including Educational Outreach efforts of the Philharmonic. |
| The ARC of Prince George's County | \$2,500 | The ARC of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support programming that supports inclusion and independent living for individuals with Intellectual / Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) by preparing them for post-secondary education and employment, and delivering activities that build work / volunteer skills. |
