Fiscal Year 2022 – 2027 Capital Improvement Program Budget Review

#### **Budget Overview**

The County Executive's FY 2022 Proposed Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget (the "CIP Budget") expenditures for the Board of Education (the "Board" or "BoE") totals \$185,887,000, a decrease of \$15,369,000, or 7.6%, under the approved budget expenditures for FY 2021. The proposed CIP Budget funding is \$70,113,000, or 27.3%, less than the Board of Education's Requested CIP Budget of \$256,000,000. The County's funding contribution through General Obligation bonds for FY 2022 is \$114,749,000.

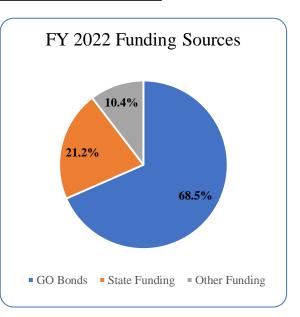

#### **Alternative Construction Financing (ACF)**

- The Alternative Construction Financing (ACF) category was added to the FY 2022 budgets with \$19,000,000 to the Board of Education's CIP Budget and \$15,000,000 in PAYGO funding in the "Other" funding category to the Operating Budget for a total of \$34,000,000 of County funding.
