<a href="#">100 Black Men of Prince George's County</a>	\$10,000	100 Black Men of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support its Saturday Leadership Academy. More specifically, funds will be used for supplies, training materials and scholarships.
<a href="#">AJF Scholarship &amp; Achievement Foundation, Inc.</a>	\$20,000	AJF Scholarship and Achievement Foundation will use grant funds to enhance education opportunities for those pursuing post-secondary education to include professional certifications. More specifically, grants will be awarded to 21 students who meet the foundation's eligibility requirements.
<a href="#">ARC of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$35,000	Grant funds will support programming that promotes community inclusion and independent living for individuals with Intellectual/ Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) by preparing them for post-secondary education and employment, and delivering activities that build work /volunteer skills.
<a href="#">Art Works Studio School, Inc.</a>	\$20,000	Grant funds will be used to provide accessible, content-rich education through virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all age groups and abilities.
<a href="#">Autism FYI</a>	\$25,000	Grant funds will be used for Autism Training for Law Enforcement, Fire and EMS and businesses as well as parenting groups, health care and the online program, Immediate Recognition Increases Safety (IRIS) Program for those with autism and other disabilities.
<a href="#">CASA de Maryland, Inc.</a>	\$100,000	Grant funds will be used to support CASA's holistic programs, services, advocacy and organizing efforts for immigrant, Latino and low-income communities in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Washington - Re-Entry</a>	\$20,000	Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Washington will use grant funds for emergency food distributions of free grocery packages and free prepared meals for residents of Prince George's County who are facing extreme food insecurity due to the COVID-19 public health crisis.
<a href="#">Central Kenilworth Ave Revitalization Community Development Corporation, Inc.</a>	\$30,000	Grant funds will be used for expenses such as salaries for program staff, to pay instructors, for supplies and for occupancy to support its holistic workforce development (including culinary arts) program at the Greater Riverdale Empowerment Center / Sarvis Cafe.
<a href="#">Champ House Recovery, Inc.</a>	\$15,000	Champ House Recovery will use grant funds to replace the HVAC systems in its group home.
<a href="#">Christmas in April Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$50,000	Christmas in April of Prince George's County grant funds will be used for purchasing materials and supplies for its 2021 event when repairs are made to the homes of selected homeowners.
<a href="#">Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)</a>	\$25,000	Grant funds will be used to fund CAAPA's The Performance Series (live and / or virtual) in "Bringing Color to the Classics."
<a href="#">Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.</a>	\$30,000	Grant funds will be used for expenses related to supporting the Drivers' Education Scholarship Program and providing educational public safety tours, Public Safety Youth Camp, Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT) Training, and the Life, Leadership and Social Skills Program.
<a href="#">Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men</a>	\$15,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
<a href="#">Community Advocates for Family &amp; Youth, Inc. (CAFY)</a>	\$10,000	Grant funds will be used to help with expenses related to the salary and benefits of a homicide specialist case manager (provides support and education to family members of homicide victims) and to add to the Client Assistance Fund (rental costs and other assistance to disadvantaged clients).
<a href="#">Community Builders, Ltd.</a>	\$50,000	Grant funds will be used to support the proposed program that will directly serve 120 children and youth grades K-12 and their parents through summer enrichment and after school programming for elementary and middle school youth, each designed to foster academic improvement, personal development, healthy lifestyles, and family functioning.
<a href="#">Community Crisis Services, Inc.</a>	\$125,000	Grant funds will be used to help with expenses related to Call Center staffing and the two homeless shelters, and increased communications costs due to COVID-19.
<a href="#">Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$50,000	Community Legal Services will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to underserved areas of the County lacking access to legal services. Legal matters handled include domestic violence, estate planning for seniors, expungement, family law and other civil legal matters.
<a href="#">Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland</a>	\$50,000	Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland, will use grant funds to provide over 575 families or 1,700 individuals monthly food assistance through Community Ministry's Food Assistance Programs and to provide related human services and health referrals to help people navigate the COVID-19 pandemic and other emergencies.
<a href="#">Community Youth Advance, Inc.</a>	\$25,000	Grant funds will be used for expenses related to staffing for programs to keep participation free for children and youth; 10% for overhead expenses.
<a href="#">Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$100,000	Grant funds will be used to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of over 200 youth in County foster care. Funds will also be used for the increased needs due to COVID of youth in care as well as those who come into care as a result of the pandemic.
<a href="#">District Heights (SMHART) Youth Development Foundation</a>	\$50,000	District Heights Family and Youth Services Bureau will use grant funds to maintain and expand its "Your Life Matters" programming which includes two workshops and program expansion.
<a href="#">Educare Resource Center, Inc.</a>	\$10,000	Grant funds will be used for operational costs for part-time staff and for COVID-related additional expenses.
<a href="#">End Time Harvest Ministries (ETHM) Pathways to Career Success Program</a>	\$75,000	Grant funds will be used to fund the Pathways to Career Success Program, which develops youth academically with a career and college preparation focus, including on-time graduation and preparation for college and workforce entry.

<a href="#">End Time Harvest Ministries (ETHM) Wellness Ambassadors Leadership Program</a>	\$50,000	Grant funds will be used to fund the Wellness Ambassadors Leadership Program, a peer education program where students learn and teach others how to make healthy lifestyle choices.
<a href="#">Engaged Community offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms</a>	\$35,000	Funds will be used to keep safely and securely producing local, healthy and affordable food and to train others to provide essential sustenance in the future.
<a href="#">First Generation College Bound, Inc.</a>	\$150,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operating expenses related to their mission of inspiring low income and first- generation youth to achieve their social and economic success by providing advice, encouragement, and support to obtain a college degree.
<a href="#">Food &amp; Friends, Inc.</a>	\$100,000	Grant funds will be used to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such HIV / AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
<a href="#">Friendship Charities Foundation, Inc.</a>	\$50,000	Grant funds will be used to support programs for senior citizens, focusing on health, nutrition and wellness. Funds will also be used to provide tutoring, mentorship, and scholarships to disadvantaged youth in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Game Plan, Inc.</a>	\$10,000	Funds will be used to provide programming for PGCPs high school students to prepare them for life after high school.
<a href="#">Glenarden Unit 275 of the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Maryland</a>	\$10,000	Glenarden Unit 275 of the American Legion Auxiliary Department of Maryland will use grant funds to support veterans, active duty military, their families, children and youth, and the community through its outreach programs.
<a href="#">Greater Baden Medical Services</a>	\$15,000	Greater Baden Medical Services will use grant funds to (1) support COVID-19 exposure and infection mitigation efforts and (2) provide partial salary support for the Greater Baden Health Team supporting hypertension control related to COVID.
<a href="#">Greater Prince George's Business Roundtable, Inc.</a>	\$140,000	Funds will be used to support furthering the relationship between Joint Base Andrews and Prince George's County. Also, \$80,000 of the grant is allotted for Prince George's Suite magazine and its efforts to provide a cultural lifestyle outlet for Prince Georgians to appreciate their home.
<a href="#">Greenbelt Community Foundation</a>	\$25,000	Funds will be used to support City of Greenbelt organizations' programs and services to the community.
<a href="#">Habitat for Humanity Metro Maryland, Inc.</a>	\$50,000	Grant funds will be used to provide low-income homeowners in Prince George's County with health- and safety-focused home repair services. Some funding will also be internally allocated for building affordable homes in Prince George's County to be sold to income-qualified buyers.
<a href="#">Heart of America Foundation</a>	\$100,000	Grant funds will be used to provide a transformation/renovation project within a Prince George's County school to increase educational equity, impact school climate and culture, and improve academic success for students (currently under review with PGPS as to which school).
<a href="#">Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Foundation</a>	\$15,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association, through Dollars for Scholars, will use grant funds to make scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors and continuing college students, as well as achievement awards to middle school students in the local communities of Prince George's County, Maryland.
<a href="#">Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.</a>	\$50,000	Hope Connections for Cancer Support will improve the cancer care approach to aid with treatment and survival in Prince George's County by providing tools to empower people with prostate cancer and their loved ones to make positive financial and mental health choices during and after treatment.
<a href="#">Housing Options &amp; Planning Enterprises, Inc. (H.O.P.E., Inc.)</a>	\$10,000	Housing Options & Planning Enterprises, Inc. (H.O.P.E., Inc.) will use grant funds to supplement current agency operating expenses to provide housing counseling during the COVID-19 pandemic. More specifically, funds will provide partial compensation for information technology needs, office equipment, telephone, internet, virtual marketing and software subscriptions to address the rising need for agency services to effectively and efficiently carry out counseling.
<a href="#">Human Services Coalition of Prince George's County, dba Nonprofit Prince George's County</a>	\$50,000	Human Services Coalition of Prince George's County, dba Nonprofit Prince George's County, will use grant funds to support its capacity building and technical assistance service provision to county nonprofits. The funds will also support its programs for county residents and nonprofit employees as the organization navigates through the pandemic and beyond, working to recover and restore after its devastation.
<a href="#">In Reach, Inc.</a>	\$25,000	Grant funds will be used to produce a full season of Teens Talk Television, a 22 episode half-hour show targeting Prince George's County, Maryland, high school students, young adults and families on their journey to college, work and life.
<a href="#">Inncuvate Community Development Partners, Inc.</a>	\$10,000	Inncuvate Community Development Partners, Inc. will use grant funds to train entrepreneur support organizations on entrepreneur ecosystem metrics and to conduct a baseline ecosystem health assessment which will measure, analyze and report on entrepreneur development activity in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County</a>	\$10,000	The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County will use grant funds to deliver Ivy League programs via a virtual environment; provide scholarships to Ivy League participants; continue to evaluate and assess the impact of programs and activities; and provide marketing and technology support for programs and services.
<a href="#">Kappa Foundation of Fort Washington</a>	\$10,000	Grant funds will be used to assist with education, training and scholarship awards for students in Prince George's County, as well as for the foundation's various outreach programs.
<a href="#">La Clinica del Pueblo, Inc.</a>	\$40,000	Funds will be used to meet the needs of Latino families in Prince George's County through the provision of comprehensive primary care and mental health services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate for low-income and uninsured county residents.
<a href="#">Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services, Inc. (LARS)</a>	\$70,000	Funds will cover the salaries of two Emergency Services Case Managers who provide homeless outreach, referral services and short-term case management to Prince George's County residents facing financial crises.
<a href="#">Liberty's Promise, Inc.</a>	\$100,000	Liberty's Promise will use grant funds to support five after-school programs of civic engagement, held at four Prince George's County High Schools (Bladensburg, High Point, Northwestern, and Parkdale), twice annually, either in person or virtually, in 10-week sessions.
<a href="#">Marlton Swim &amp; Recreation Club, Inc. (no website)</a>	\$55,000	Funds will be used to get through the time period of being closed due to COVID-19 and to complete concrete decking around "splash pad" and other repairs to the facility.

<a href="#">Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care</a>	\$20,000	Funds will allow Mary's Center to continue providing crucial maternal health care to pregnant women at its Adelphi site in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.</a>	\$25,000	Grant funds will be used to purchase food items to assist in the preparation of meals for its clients and help maintain the price of the daily client contribution for service. Funds may also be used for paper products related to providing the daily meals.
<a href="#">Milton Matthews Foundation, Inc.</a>	\$35,000	Milton Matthews Foundation will use grant funds to fund critical anti-drug use programming and the addition of new clinical intake services, new substance abuse counseling, and continued positive reinforcement theatre arts public messaging to the allied homeless feeding efforts already conducted.
<a href="#">Mission of Love Charities, Inc.</a>	\$80,000	Grant funds will be used to support services to low-income and homeless individuals in Prince George's County. Services will include provision of food, job training, furniture, clothing, mental health referrals, day center.
<a href="#">NAMI Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$20,000	NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to providing mental health support, education, advocacy and community outreach for county residents.
<a href="#">Neighborhood Design Center</a>	\$10,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds for continuity of pro bono design services during the COVID health and economic crisis.
<a href="#">Olde Mill Foundation</a>	\$10,000	Grant funds will be used to help supplement the salary of the program administrator (responsible for case management, scheduling and correspondence), purchase supplies for the Saturday enrichment program and Art Therapy, printing and postage.
<a href="#">Out Teach (Fr. REAL School Gardens)</a>	\$25,000	Real School Gardens will use funds to cover a portion of the salaries and benefits of one Instructional Coach and one Project Manager as they implement all of the components of the Out Teach program in the selected Prince George's County schools.
<a href="#">People for Change Coalition, Inc.</a>	\$10,000	People for Change Coalition will use grant funds to provide capacity building and technical assistance to nonprofits in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Prince George's Child Resource Center, Inc.</a>	\$40,000	Prince George's Child Resource Center will use grant funds for general operating support to sustain its full suite of programs which help families and child care providers navigate educational, economic and health challenges, especially in the era of COVID-19.
<a href="#">Prince George's Community College Foundation</a>	\$40,000	Grant funds will be used to pay for credits via which County arts organizations can rent PGCC's Center for the Performing Arts (CPA). Funds will also be used to obtain improved digital production resources that can be used by the CPA and other County groups.
<a href="#">Prince George's Tennis &amp; Education Foundation</a>	\$20,000	Grant funds will be used to help support and introduce the academic, athletic and civic benefits of tennis through tennis instruction, athletic training and workshops.
<a href="#">Roberta's House</a>	\$10,000	Funds will be used to hire one part-time (20 hours / week) group facilitator who will lead the grief support group, A Time Sharing, for families and individuals who have lost loved ones from COVID-19 or any other causes of death.
<a href="#">Rockville Economic Development, Inc. (REDI), Maryland Women's Business Center (MWBC)</a>	\$45,000	Rockville Economic Development, Inc., Maryland Women's Business Center will use grant funds to provide for Prince George's County business counselor services to continue to provide business counseling and support to women in business in Prince George's County. More specifically, funds will be used to help support a full-time Senior Business Counselor dedicated to providing one-on-one counseling and workshop training in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Side by Side Inc.</a>	\$20,000	Grant funds will be used to help cover expenses for conducting 30 online workshops for parents of students at six partner schools in Laurel and Beltsville, and provide reading coaches to meet biweekly online with 50 individual students who need extra help in building reading skills.
<a href="#">Solutions in Hometown Connections Corporation</a>	\$25,000	Solutions in Hometown Connections Corp. will use grant funds for staff salaries and student curriculum for its English Language Learner Program.
<a href="#">Stone of Help Community Development Corporation</a>	\$30,000	Stone of Help Community Development Corporation will use grant funds for COVID-19 relief support efforts, including mental health workshops, basic housing support services (i.e., rent, mortgage, emergency housing assistance), food and utilities.
<a href="#">Take Charge Juvenile Diversion Program, Inc.</a>	\$50,000	Grant funds will be used for implementing the online version of the Take Charge Life Blueprint Curriculum in three TNI Prince George's County public schools.
<a href="#">The First Tee of Greater Washington</a>	\$25,000	The First Tee of Greater Washington will use grant funds for general operation expenses of youth development programs in Prince George's County, including both afterschool and in-school. More specifically, funds will be used for its afterschool Life Skills Experience Program, with a small portion being used to remove students from the wait list, to hire and train coaches, and to provide transportation options from community centers.
<a href="#">The Foundation for the Advancement of Music &amp; Education, Inc. (FAME)</a>	\$150,000	The Foundation for the Advancement of Music & Education will use grant funds to support ongoing programs and expansion of FAME's Online Learning platform (distance learning).
<a href="#">The Foundation Schools</a>	\$10,000	The Foundation Schools will use grant funds to provide Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) and other necessary safety measures for return to in-person instruction.
<a href="#">The University of Maryland College Park Foundation, Inc. - Incentive Awards Program</a>	\$150,000	The University of Maryland College Park Foundation will use grant funds for scholarships to students from Prince George's County to attend the University of Maryland through its Incentive Award Program (IAP).
<a href="#">United Communities Against Poverty, Inc. [UCAP]</a>	\$10,000	Grant funds will be used for general operating support; more specifically, to supplement the upgrade and maintenance of its information technology services to benefit staff and Prince George's County residents.
<a href="#">World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium</a>	\$100,000	World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium, will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting its Creative Works program, a seven-month vocational training program for high school seniors and recently out-of-school youth which provides technical artistic skill-based training as well as curriculum in life skills, job readiness and college preparation.
