Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now	\$3,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now, will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich education through virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all age groups and abilities; and to provide free pizzas and art activities to essential workers and those experiencing food and income insecurity.
BCAUSEICAN, Inc.	\$3,000	BCAUSEICAN, Inc. will use grant funds to cover the costs of a program manager to oversee the rapid expansion of our classes in Prince George's County.
Beacon Heights Elementary School	\$1,000	Beacon Heights Elementary School will use grant funds to beautify Beacon Heights Elementary School by creating various murals in the main areas of the building. School beautification not only encourages student involvement, but also brings schools and communities together.
B-Roll Media	\$1,500	B-Roll Media will use grant funds to help support cost-free media arts education and training for underserved youth ages 13-21 and youth with diagnosed learning disabilities in Prince George's County, Maryland. More specifically, funds will help cover the costs of salaries / wages for instructors and for equipment.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$1,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
College Park Arts Exchange, Inc.	\$1,500	College Park Arts Exchange will use grant funds to address physical and mental health needs during quarantine by providing free arts programming online, including weekly classes in Soul Line Dancing, Introduction to Tap, Draw Like an Artist, and Exploring Creative Writing.
Community Ministry of Prince George's County	\$3,750	Community Ministry of Prince George's County will use grants funds to provide monthly 250 to 350 housing assistance applicants (mostly mothers with children) consultations, referral services, and small grants to help qualified Prince Georgians avoid eviction resulting from COVID-19 hardships.
Community Youth Advance	\$2,500	Community Youth Advance will use grant funds to deliver year-round academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.
Congregations United for Compassion & Empowerment, Inc.	\$2,500	Congregations United for Compassion & Empowerment, Inc. will use grant funds for their Prince Georges Plaza Day Center which provides a safe environment including food, warm clothes, showers, laundry, and referrals for homeless and marginal individuals in Prince Georges County.
Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) / Prince George's County, Inc.	\$3,000	Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) / Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of over 200 youth in County foster care. Funds will also be used for the increased needs due to COVID of youth in care as well as those who come into care as a result of the pandemic.
End Time Harvest Ministries	\$2,500	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to contract an Organization Developer for one year to help the founding Executive Director / President to administer the organization's strategic plan and to provide scholarships to 2021 graduating seniors.
Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms	\$3,000	Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms, will use grant funds to safely and securely produce local, healthy and affordable food, as well as support its capacity to feed its neighbors in this time of need and to train others to provide essential sustenance in the future.
First Generation College Bound	\$4,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operating expenses related to their mission of inspiring low income and first- generation youth to achieve their social and economic success by providing advice, encouragement, and support to obtain a college degree.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$4,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.

Homes Not Borders	\$3,750	Homes Not Borders will use grant funds to pay refugee artisans to make home goods and other small furniture that Homes Not Borders can use when setting up homes for new refugees, as well as sell to the general public.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$2,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc. will use grant funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness, and hope.
La Clinica Del Pueblo	\$3,000	La Clinica Del Pueblo will use grant funds to meet the needs of Latino families in Prince George's County through the provision of comprehensive primary care and mental health services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate for low-income and uninsured county residents.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$4,000	Liberty's Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to support their after-school program of civic engagement, held at Parkdale High School, twice annually, either in person or virtually, in 10 week sessions.
LINDABEN FOUNDATION, Inc.	\$3,000	LINDABEN FOUNDATION will use grant funds to support their pilot school - Carrollton Elementary (Adopt-A-School) program through their Parent Resource Center.

More specifically, funds will be used for transportation expenses, supplies, league registration fees & uniforms.

Neighborhood Design Center	\$4,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds for continuity of pro bono design services during the COVID health and economic crisis.

Sowing Empowerment & Economic Development, Inc.	\$5,000	Sowing Empowerment & Economic Development will use grant funds to provide free emergency food to low-to-moderate income families in District 3, especially those affected by COVID-19 pandemic.
The ARC of Prince George's County	\$2,500	The ARC of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support programming that supports inclusion and independent living for individuals with Intellectual / Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) by preparing them for post-secondary education and employment, and delivering activities that build work / volunteer skills.
