<a href="#">Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church</a>	\$10,000	Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church will use grant funds to purchase and distribute 550 Thanksgiving turkey baskets to District 1 families.
<a href="#">Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services, Inc. (LARS)</a>	\$10,000	Laurel Advocacy and Referral Services, Inc. (LARS) will use grant funds to cover Emergency Services Program staff salaries and to provide direct financial assistance to Laurel residents facing eviction or utility cutoff.
<a href="#">First Generation College Bound, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operational expenses. More specifically, funds will be used to support the College Success and Homework Club programs and related expenses.
<a href="#">Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area will use grant funds to purchase food items to assist in the preparation of meals for its clients. The more than tripling of its client base, along with the need to relocate, has stretched the organization's budget. Funds will help to maintain the price of the daily client fee.
<a href="#">Side by Side, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Side by Side will use grant funds to provide one-to-one family academic coaching to families with academically struggling students in partnering Prince George's County Public Schools.
<a href="#">Woman's Club of Laurel, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Woman's Club of Laurel will use grant funds to purchase food and related items for its Tummy Tamers Program, which provides weekend bags of food to elementary school children who have been identified as food-insecure.
<a href="#">Patrons for Peace Project, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Patrons for Peace Project, Inc. will use grant funds to provide clients with help with half-way house rent until employment is obtained, transportation to medical facilities, court and commissioner's office, temporary monetary support until SNAP benefits, purchase of cell phone and cell service.
<a href="#">The Laurel Historical Society, Inc.</a>	\$4,000	The Laurel Historical Society, Inc. will use grant funds in support of the Laurel Museum's virtual educational programs and activities for children and adults.
<a href="#">Laurel 4th of July Committee</a>	\$4,000	Laurel 4th of July Committee is use grants funds for the City of Laurel's 4th of July Celebration, with fireworks, parade, music and vendors.
<a href="#">Cherry Lane Boxing and Youth Fitness</a>	\$4,000	Cherry Lane Boxing and Youth Fitness will use grant funds for purchasing necessary equipment for participants and cleaning supplies to remain COVID-safe. Items included are uniforms, registration, sanctions and supplies.
<a href="#">Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$3,750	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide general legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services, including its Pilot Jail program to assist inmates in the Prince George's County Detention Center and representation for survivors of domestic violence.
<a href="#">Liberty's Promise, Inc.</a>	\$3,500	Liberty's Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to support an after-school program of civic engagement, held at High Point High School, twice annually, either in-person or virtually, in 10-week sessions, running from March to May and again from October to December.
<a href="#">Laurel Cats, Inc.</a>	\$3,000	Laurel Cats will use grant funds to assist residents of Prince George's County District One with medical expenses for cats that they own, as well as catching and altering outdoor cats.
<a href="#">Community Youth Advance, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	Community Youth Advance, Inc. will use grant funds to deliver year-round quality academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.
<a href="#">College Park Arts Exchange, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	College Park Arts Exchange, Inc., will use grant funds to pay teachers, artists and associated program costs.
<a href="#">Arc of Prince George's County</a>	\$2,500	Arc of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support their programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and their Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.

<a href="#">Food &amp; Friends, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide home-delivered, medically-tailored meals and groceries to people living with serious illnesses like HIV, cancer, diabetes, COPD, end-stage renal disease, etc., whose illness prevents them from shopping for and preparing food for themselves.
<a href="#">Beltsville Community Cats, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	Beltsville Community Cats (BCC) will use grant funds to spay / neuter and vaccinate free-roaming cats in Beltsville; to offset some of the costs of cat food purchased by BCC volunteers who feed feral colonies (170 cats) living on commercial and industrial properties and who make up BCC's foster care network; and to pay for vet services for sick and injured community cats.
<a href="#">Beltsville Soccer Academy</a>	\$2,500	Beltsville Soccer Academy will use grant funds to support soccer practice and competitions for multiple teams of different ages throughout the calendar year.
<a href="#">Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc will use grant funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness, and hope.
<a href="#">Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, Inc.</a>	\$2,000	Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care will use grant funds to continue providing wellness, prenatal and behavioral health services to uninsured participants amidst the pandemic at its Adelphi health clinic in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.</a>	\$2,000	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy, and community outreach programs for County residents.
<a href="#">Laurel for the Patuxent, Inc.</a>	\$2,000	Laurel for the Patuxent, Inc. will use grant funds to expand outreach to the Laurel community by raising awareness about its various activities including reforestation along the Patuxent River, support to native plant pollinator gardens and advocating and informing for sustainable watershed development.
<a href="#">Crosswood, Inc., dba The Pathways Schools</a>	\$1,250	Crosswood, Inc., dba The Pathways Schools will use grant funds for its Hoop Ed program, a therapeutic basketball program for its students who have emotional and behavioral disorders.
<a href="#">Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc.</a>	\$1,000	Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc. will use grant funds to support their efforts in expanding their programs, provide organizational funding needed due to a lack of fundraising, due to COVID-19. Funds will also help them to establish new partnerships in the County to expand the number of youth they can receive.
<a href="#">Art Works Studio School, Inc.</a>	\$1,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc. will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages.
<a href="#">Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc.</a>	\$1,000	Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc. will use grant funds to support educational outreach efforts and rehearsal/concert venue rental fees.
<a href="#">Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council, Inc.</a>	\$1,000	Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council will use grant funds to offset fund cuts to its signature grant program which supports artists, arts organizations and agencies throughout the County through Artist Fellowships, County Arts (organizations), Arts in Education and Public Art.
<a href="#">Community Forklift</a>	\$1,000	Community Forklift will use grant funds for expenses related to its Home Essentials Program (HELP) which provides free home materials to underserved residents in District 1 of Prince George's County and beyond.
<a href="#">ecoLatinos, Inc.</a>	\$1,000	ecoLatinos will use grant funds for supporting volunteer outreach at Prince George's County waterways - tent, tables, flyers, water - to educate the public on water quality. Funds will also used to help pay the project coordinator, the social media campaign designer for 10 weeks of social media outreach and to purchase plants as gifts for the volunteers.
<a href="#">Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms</a>	\$1,000	Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms will use grant funds for expenses related to safely and securely producing local, healthy and affordable food. These include continued support of ECO City Farms' capacity to feed its neighbors in this time of need and to train others to provide essential sustenance in the future. More specifically, funds will be used for farm staff salaries, taxes and benefits, for farm operations and for educational programming.
