<a href="#">Food &amp; Friends, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide home-delivered, medically-tailored meals and groceries to people living with serious illnesses like HIV, cancer, diabetes, COPD, end-stage renal disease, etc., whose illness prevents them from shopping for and preparing food for themselves.
<a href="#">First Generation College Bound, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operational expenses. More specifically, funds will be used to support the College Success and Homework Club programs and related expenses.
<a href="#">Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc. will use grant funds to support their efforts in expanding their programs, provide organizational funding needed due to a lack of fundraising, due to COVID-19. Funds will also help them to establish new partnerships in the County to expand the number of youth they can receive.
<a href="#">End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to continue their ETHM's Pathway to Career Success program, which develops youth academically with a career and college preparation focus, including on-time graduation and preparation for college and workforce entry.
<a href="#">Liberty's Promise, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Liberty's Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to support an after-school program of civic engagement, held at Parkdale High School, twice annually, either in-person or virtually, in 10-week sessions, running from March to May and again from October to December.
<a href="#">Lindaben Foundation</a>	\$4,000	Lindaben Foundation will use grant funds to supports its Feeding the Kids on Weekends program to serve a Title I school in District 3.
<a href="#">Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, Inc.</a>	\$4,000	Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care will use grant funds to continue providing wellness, prenatal and behavioral health services to uninsured participants amidst the pandemic at its Adelphi health clinic in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Bcauseican, Inc.</a>	\$4,000	Bcauseican, Inc. will use grant funds to pay for 16% of the cost of bringing its coding and technology workshops to five (5) Prince George's County community schools in District 3 which have had their community school budgets cut for this school year.
<a href="#">Defensores de la Cuenca</a>	\$4,000	Defensores de la Cuenca will use grant funds to engage youth and their families collaboration with Greater Riverdale Thrives/High Point/Bladensburg High School in watershed/nature based activities/experiences through a Youth Corps model that is family-friendly, promotes stewardship, and provide service learning hrs.

<a href="#">Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$3,500	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide general legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services, including its Pilot Jail program to assist inmates in the Prince George's County Detention Center and representation for survivors of domestic violence.
<a href="#">Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.</a>	\$3,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc will use grant funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness, and hope.
<a href="#">Anacostia Trails Heritage Area, Inc.</a>	\$3,000	Anacostia Trails Heritage Area will use grant funds to make Spanish-language translation of English-only self-guided cultural / historical trail and tour maps / brochures. Funds will also be used for web publishing.
<a href="#">La Clinica Del Pueblo, Inc.</a>	\$3,000	La Clinica Del Pueblo will use the funds to meet the healthcare needs of Latino families in Prince George's County through the provision of comprehensive primary care and mental health services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate for low-income and uninsured county residents.

<a href="#">Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.</a>	\$3,000	Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area will use grant funds to purchase food items to assist in the preparation of meals for its clients. The more than tripling of its client base, along with the need to relocate, has stretched the organization's budget. Funds will help to maintain the price of the daily client fee.
<a href="#">World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium</a>	\$3,000	World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium will use grant funds for CreativeWorks, a paid workforce development program that provides young adults ages 17 - 24 with technical theatre, digital media, life skills, and college and career preparedness training.
<a href="#">Art Works Studio School, Inc.</a>	\$3,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc. will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages.
<a href="#">Lillian's Place Company</a>	\$3,000	Lillian's Place Company will use grant funds to provide educational, vocational and employment services to at risk youth 16-24 residing in the Prince George's County areas, as well as assisting low-income families in PG and area Districts.

Woodlawn.

CASA will respond to increased needs, due to COVID, of youth in care as well as those who come into care as a result of the pandemic.

<a href="#">Community Crisis Services Inc.</a>	\$1,500	Community Crisis Services Inc. will use grant funds to provide one (1) Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) trainings and one (1) Assessing Suicide in Kids (ASK) trainings to up to twenty five (25) persons each for a total of 50 community members trained in suicide prevention and crisis intervention.

<a href="#">PTA of Riverdale Elementary School</a>	\$1,000	PTA of Riverdale Elementary School will use grant funds towards the purchase of 10 ChromeBooks and 10 ChromeBook covers for parents to loan and take the Rosetta Stone courses at the school library.
<a href="#">Beacon Heights Elementary School</a>	\$1,000	Beacon Heights Elementary School will use grant funds to purchase a microphone and speaker system for their school, as their current system is old and no longer works. The system will allow them to continue to execute successful school/student events as well as parent engagement events.
